Visa Application

If you are coming to Australia and you are NOT a permanent resident or Australia Citizen, you will need to apply for a Visa and have that approved before you can travel.

Short-term working holiday options *(the title of visa below, links to gov website)*

The most common visa for people coming to Australia who intended to work at some stage throughout their travel are;

[Subclass 417 - Working Holiday visa](#)

This visa lets people 18 to 30 years old (inclusive) - and Canadian, French and Irish citizens 18 to 35 years old (inclusive) - have their first extended holiday in Australia and work here to help fund their trip.

[Subclass 462 - Work and Holiday visa](#)

This visa lets people 18 to 30 years old (inclusive) have an extended holiday in Australia and work here to help fund their trip.

Understanding which visa to apply for will depend on your place of residence and passport you carry as eligibility is different. Make sure to check the [eligibility tab](#) in the links above to know what visa will accept your passport.

Long-term sponsorship Options

If you are a Cook, Chef, Restaurant Manager or Café Manager, you may be eligible for sponsorship. Applejack Hospitality can offer sponsorship to overseas workers on Temporary working visas that will allow you to work on a permanent fulltime basis for 4 years or more. These include.

[Subclass 482 - Temporary Skill Shortage visa](#)

This visa enables employers to address labour shortages by bringing in skilled workers where employers can't source an appropriately skilled Australian worker. Occupations include - Cooks, Chefs, Restaurant Managers or Café Managers

[Subclass 407 - Training visa](#)

This visa allows you to take part in workplace-based occupational training activities to improve your skills for your job, area of tertiary study, field of expertise or in a professional development training program in Australia.
